City Heights MSW Scholarship Program

Funded by Price Philanthropies, the City Heights Master of Social Work Scholarship was created to address the need to support a bilingual, culturally responsive social work workforce and increase the number and diversity of well-trained and highly committed Master-level clinical social workers in the City Heights area of San Diego. This scholarship will provide support services and tuition assistance to two MSW students who have experience living and/or working in City Heights, qualify for financial assistance, have an interest in becoming a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) and are passionate about serving mental health needs in City Heights upon graduation. Please note, the selection process will a include a panel interview. Qualified and admitted MSW students who are awarded this scholarship will receive up to \$11,418 each year toward amount of total cost of attendance, as determined by the SDSU Financial Aid Office, for up to 2 years.

Student Selection Criteria:

To be considered for the SDSU School of Social Work City Heights MSW Scholarship program, candidates must:

- Be accepted for full-time enrollment to the SDSU MSW Program for the 2020-2021 academic year
- Enroll in the 2-year MSW direct practice concentration
- Have experience living and/or working in the City Heights community
- Have a minimum 3.0 undergraduate cumulative GPA
- Have a Bachelor's degree in social work, psychology, sociology, counseling, or a related field of study
- Demonstrate financial need through the completion of the FAFSA
- Have experience working and/or interning/volunteering in a community setting
- Demonstrate commitment to working in a clinical setting or with children and families
- Include a sponsorship letter from a City Heights community organization that details your involvement and commitment to the City Height's community. This letter must be on agency letterhead.


Preferred candidates will:

- Be bilingual and will have demonstrated proficiency in languages such as: Somali, Khmer, Burmese,
 Vietnamese, Arabic, or Amharic
- Have a demonstrated interest in working with immigrant and refugee populations
