Official SDSU transcripts showing that the degree was awarded can take up to 6 weeks after the diploma date. Diplomas are mailed 8-10 weeks after the diploma date. You must verify that the "mailing" address for the diploma is correct in my.SDSU.

[Applying for graduation](#)

You must apply for graduation through your my.SDSU account (**\$181 graduation application fee**), even if not attending the commencement ceremony. If you do not graduate, your application will automatically re-evaluated for up to 3 semesters. [Deadline descriptions](#)

- ¹ Thesis submission requires a signed cover page, electronic copy of appropriately formatted thesis, and a **thesis review fee**. Submissions during this semester (see the exact date range above) require 799A or 799B enrollment this semester, which will be verified at the time of submission. If thesis *publication* takes place in the next semester, a new 799A/799B registration will not be required. Additional fees are required if three or more formatting reviews are required by Montezuma Publishing.
- ² The submission deadline for [Montezuma Publishing](#) is "low risk", rather than strict. Students who submit by this deadline and have few formatting errors are very likely to receive a degree in the same semester. The likelihood of missing this semester's *publication* deadline increases with each passing day that the thesis is not yet submitted. Documents are reviewed in the order received.
- ³ If you decide to hire [Montezuma Publishing](#) (MP) for formatting, the thesis may need to be submitted earlier than the Formatted Thesis "low risk" Submission Deadline above. MP has limited staff, and formatting orders are accepted on a first-come first-served basis. After the queue is full in a particular semester, additional submissions will be scheduled for formatting, publishing, and degree issuance in the following semester. Similarly, if you hire an off-campus formatter, discuss deadlines and submission procedures with them directly.
- ⁴ The publication deadline is a strict 2:45 PM deadline for thesis formatting approval and payment of the **publication fee**. The degree cannot be issued this semester if fee payment and publication approval occurs after this date. until the following semester. **This is a strict deadline.** The publishing fee covers ProQuest submission, electronic files, and SDSU Library abstract. Thesis publication is a degree requirement and the thesis is not "published" until final payment is made.
